Installing OverDrive Media Console on your Mac*

What you'll need to get started:

- A computer with Mac iOS 10.4.9 or newer
- Intel or PowerPC Processor
- iTunes version 7.6.2.9 or newer

***Note: WMA files are NOT compatible with Macs**

Go to <http://delaware.lib.overdrive.com>

Go to the bottom of the page and click "Applications." Click "**OverDrive.**" Click "**Download OverDrive.**" Click "**Available for Mac.**"

Click "**Save File.**" Double click the installation file once download is complete. You may need to go back to the desktop and double click on the **OverDrive** file. Then double click on the file to open the **installation wizard.**

Click "**Continue**" Review the Licensing Agreement. Click "**Continue**" Click "**Agree**". Click "**Install**" to begin the installation. Once the installation is complete, click "**Close.**"

To locate the file, go to **Finder** and search your **Applications** for the **OverDrive** app. Double click to open the file. It will then also appear in your dock.

Burning an MP3 eAudiobook to CD using ODMC for Mac

What you'll need to get started:

- OverDrive for Mac version 1.1 or newer
- Blank recordable CD (CD-R or CD-RW)
- A CD/DVD burning drive on your computer
- Downloaded audiobook (To check out an audiobook see the **MP3** or **iPod** handout.)

Please respect the digital rights and destroy the CD at the end of the lending period

To see if your title can be burned to CD go to the digital library catalog (delaware.lib.overdrive.com), hover over the title, then click "**more**" to open its details page. Scroll down, then click "**Digital Rights Information.**"

Open OverDrive by double-clicking on the icon on your desktop.

Click on the title that you wish to burn and click the "**Burn**" button at the top of the screen.

Insert a blank CD into your computer's disc drive. (You'll need one CD for each part.) Click "**Next**" Select the parts to transfer. Click "**Next.**" When the burn is complete, click "**Finish.**"

Why won't it play?

If you're having trouble listening to the CD you burned, check to make sure that your CD player will play CD-R discs. If you used a CD-RW disc, try burning the title again using a CD-R. Most players have trouble with CD-RWs for audio CDs.

Installing OverDrive on your Windows PC

What you'll need to get started:

- A computer with Windows XP or newer
- Microsoft Internet Explorer 7 or newer
- Windows Media Player 9 or newer (to download WMA files) Most computers have this pre-installed, if you need to reinstall it or upgrade to version 9 or newer, go to: <http://windows.microsoft.com/en-US/windows/downloads/windows-media-player>

To download OverDrive for Windows, click “**Download for Windows Desktop**” at <http://omc.overdrive.com/windows.php>

Click “**Save File.**” Double click the installation file once download is complete. Click “**OK.**”

Click “**Run**” to open the ODMC Installation Wizard.

Click “**Next.**” Review the Licensing Agreement. Click “**I Agree.**” Click “**Next.**” Click “**Next**” again.

Click “**Next**” to begin the installation. Once the installation is complete, click “**Close.**” Minimize all windows to return to your desktop. Double click on the Overdrive Media Console icon.

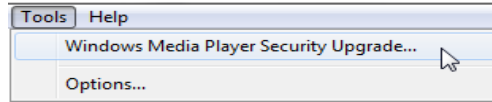

Performing the Windows Media Player Security Upgrade

The first time you try to download a title to ODMC software on your computer, you may receive a prompt to upgrade the security of Windows Media Player. This upgrade is needed in order to play WMA-formatted titles protected with DRM (Digital Rights Management.)

You can also launch the update yourself. In the OverDrive Media Console: Click on **Tools > Windows Media Player Security Upgrade**. Click **OK** to open Windows Media Player.



The next steps will vary slightly depending on which version of Windows Media Player you have.

For Version 11

Click “**OK**” to Open Windows Media Player. Click “**Upgrade**” in the Windows Media Player dialog box.



Click “**Close**” once the upgrade is complete. Then click “**Play**” in *Windows Media Player* to confirm that you have completed the upgrade.

For Version 9 or 10

Click “**OK**” to Open Windows Media Player. Click “**OK**” in the Security Upgrade Required dialog box.



If you get an Active X pop up in the next window, Click the message and then click “**Run Add-On**” Click “**Play**” to complete the upgrade.

Burning a WMA or MP3 eAudiobook to CD using OverDrive for Windows

What you'll need to get started:

- OverDrive for Windows version 3.2. or newer
- Blank recordable CD (CD-R or CD-RW) (1 disk for each part of the eAudiobook)
- A CD/DVD burning drive on your computer
- A downloaded audiobook (To check out an eAudiobook see the **MP3** or **iPod** handout.)

Please respect the digital rights and destroy the CD at the end of the lending period.

To see if your title can be burned to CD, click a title to open its details page. Scroll down, then click “**Digital Rights Information.**”



Open OverDrive by double clicking on the icon on your desktop.

Click on the title that you wish to burn and click the “**Burn**” button at the top of the screen.

Insert a blank CD into your computer's disc drive. Click “**Next**” Select the parts to transfer. Click “**Next.**” When download is complete, click “**Finish.**”

Why won't it play?

If you're having trouble listening to the CD you burned, check to make sure that your CD player will play CD-R discs. If you used a CD-RW disc, try burning the title again using a CD-R. Most players have trouble with CD-RWs for audio CDs.

Because OverDrive **WMA files** have DRM protection, you need to burn **audio CDs** for library titles. **Each part of a title requires a CD.** If you copied the WMA files directly to a CD, **it will not work.**
